### Jason talks about GEOCACHING

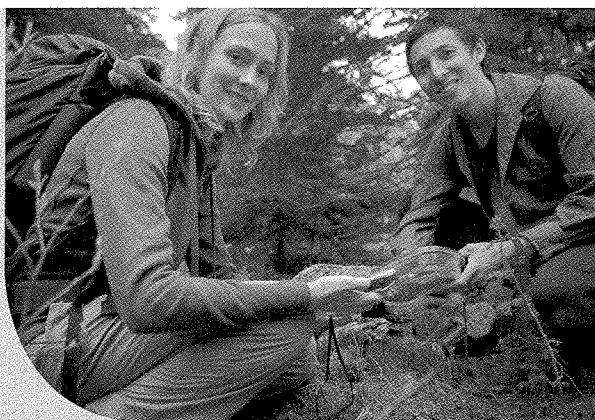
Geocaching is a great hobby, where you have to try to find hidden containers in the countryside from information that's posted on the internet by other people. Using an app with a

map, you can find the location and race your friends to be the first one there and open the container. It's surprising what people leave inside and there are some hiding places that I would never have thought of.

My initial experience with geocaching was quite an adventure. My whole group was new to the activity, so it wasn't the best-planned trip. The first problem was with technology. My phone didn't have enough memory to download the app, so I ended up having to share with a friend. This meant that either we had to go at the same speed or one of us got left behind and wasn't able to join in. That one was often me when I felt tired.

Since then, I have become quite a fan and I even create my own geocaches, where I put objects such as badges, sweets or even sometimes money, for others to find. There's a real community of people who are into playing. They have set up clubs to get together to play and then go for a meal afterwards. There are numerous blogs about the best gifts to replace anything you take or where there might be a new geocache. You might wonder what the farmers and others who live in the countryside think about this invasion of hunters but in general they seem quite happy as long as the visitors respect the environment and their privacy.

So, if you want to try something new and get out in the fresh air, call a few friends and take them for a day's hunting. It's perfect for families with children, especially those who protest when their parents try to get them off their screens and outside. The motivation of going from one hiding place to another as fast as possible means they walk a long way without realising, and even enjoy spending time with their parents!

# Katie Swan

Many young tennis stars were given a racket almost as soon as they could walk and played seriously from an early age. But this was not the case for Katie Swan. ## LEARNING ABOUT DOLPHINS

### My experience volunteering at a dolphin centre over the summer

I live in Western Australia, where there are loads of marine animals, but dolphins are among my favourites, so when I saw an advert for teenagers to take part in a volunteer project called *Dolphin Days*, I decided to join. As volunteers we had to work in groups to create information sessions and activities for children visiting the centre. This meant doing our own research about dolphins and deciding what was most interesting.

(1) ..... We discovered that scientists think they actually have conversations with each other! (2) ..... The dolphins may be talking about where the best fish are or if there is a dangerous shark in the area.

We can hear some of the noises dolphins make but they also make other sounds, which the human ear can't hear. I was surprised to find out that they find food using 'echolocation'. This is when a sound travels to an object, which gives an 'echo' – the sound comes back and can be heard again.

(3) ..... When they hear their echo, the dolphins know the object's shape and size, and can decide if it is a fish or octopus, which might be good to eat, or just a rock.

The volunteer group I took part in invented an activity that was a lot of fun. First, we covered the children's eyes with a scarf. Then, they had to try and find different objects in the room.

(4) ..... They discovered that if you go closer to an object, like a box, you can hear the sound coming back from it, but you have to listen very carefully!

These Dolphin Days were only a small part of a project to teach people that our oceans need to be respected and protected.
